Last week we received notification of students who gained NZQA New Zealand scholarship awards from the 2022 Scholarship examinations. This is the most challenging New Zealand Academic award and from St Andrew's College 85 students participated in 24 scholarship assessments.

A remarkable 76 scholarships were gained by 33 students which places them in the top 2 - 3% of New Zealand students in that subject. An Outstanding scholarship places a student in the top 0.3% of New Zealand.

Achieving a scholarship comes with a monetary prize from NZQA, and also recognition from the St Andrew's College Board of Governors. From NZQA, three scholarships earn you \$6000 over three years with extra money attached to premier, outstanding scholar, and top scholar awards.



Of the 76 awards, 12 were outstanding. By subject there were:

- 2. 8 English including 1 Outstanding
- 3. 8 Chemistry including 1 Outstanding
- 4. 8 Statistics including 1 Outstanding
- 5. 8 Geography

- 8. 6 Biology including 1 Outstanding
- 9. 3 Physical Education
- 10. 2 Drama including 2 Outstanding
- 11. 2 History
- 12. 2 Classics
- 13. 2 Agriculture and Horticulture
- 14. 1 outstanding Photography
- 15. 1 each for Religious Education, Design and Visual Communication, Art Design, Media and Music

The final awards are presented to a group of four students who will be no strangers to you.

They were recipients of the Premier Academic Awards at last year's Prizegiving – Proxime Accessit, Tom Edwards and Dux, Toby Harvie, Luke Zhu and Corin Simcock.

Remarkably all have achieved exceptional results in their Scholarship exams, achieving an incredible 29 scholarships between them.

Toby Harvie achieved seven scholarships in Digital Technology, Geography, Chemistry, Physics, English and Statistics with an Outstanding in Calculus. Toby also achieved an Outstanding Scholar Award which places him in the top 62 scholars across New Zealand and brings a \$15,000 recognition. Congratulations Toby. (Also Chemistry, Physics, Calculus, Technology and Geography in Year 12 – 2021)

Luke Zhu achieved eight scholarships in Geography, Chemistry, Physics, English, Statistics, Calculus, Agriculture and Horticulture, with an Outstanding in Biology.

Luke also achieved an Outstanding Scholar Award which places him in the top 62 scholars across New Zealand and brings a \$15,000 recognition. (Also Chemistry, Physics and Geography in Year 12 – 2021)

Tom Edwards achieved seven scholarships in Geography, Chemistry, Physics, Classics, Calculus with two Outstanding in Digital Technology and Statistics. Tom also achieved an Outstanding Scholar Award with a \$15,000 recognition. But wait there's more. Tom also achieved a Top Subject Scholar Award which earns him a further \$6000 recognition for top mark in New Zealand in Digital Technology. He will be invited to Wellington to be presented

with his Top Subject Scholar Award at a special ceremony. (Also Physics and Geography in Year 12 – 2021)

This now brings us to Corin Simcock. Corin also achieved seven scholarships: Geography, Physics, Statistics and Biology and an impressive three at the Outstanding level in Digital Technology, Chemistry and Calculus. (Also Chemistry, Physics, Calculus and Geography in Year 12 – 2021)

This incredible exam performance places Corin as one of the top 11 NZQA Scholars in New Zealand and has earned him a most prestigious Premier Award.

With this comes a \$30,000 recognition to assist with university studies and an invitation to be presented with the Premier Award from the Prime Minister in Wellington. St Andrew's College has had three Premier Award winners in the last 12 years, Sarah Wright in 2011, Russell Boey in 2018 and now Corin in 2022.

For this incredible achievement I am delighted to also present Corin with a Rector's Medal, the highest recognition at St Andrew's College for an outstanding achievement.

I believe today we have all witnessed something very special. Every year at StAC we see some students who achieve remarkable success in academic, sporting and cultural endeavour. We are inspired by them, not only what they achieve but the way they go about getting there.

Toby, Luke, Tom and Corin, and all the other scholarship recipients have thrived on the challenges they have been offered at St Andrew's. They have grasped opportunities and pursued not only academic success, but character and skill development through sport, culture, leadership and service.

These four boys are great mates. They have collaborated in their studies and supported each other and in this way, they have also thrived on the competitive spirit. It is a fine example of how we all can do our best when we work together in the pursuit of excellence.
