## **POEMS**

#### Year 5

First place: Gathering Together by Violet Winterbourn (Year 5)

Second place: Dawn till Dusk by Georgia Blyde (Year 5)

With its clever structure, this poem gradually unfolds down the page. The poet encourages the reader to take in, and think about, every detail of a day – and a life – on the farm.

## Years 0-3

First place: Baby cows by Annabelle Andrews (Year 1)

The repetition in this poem, and the gentle images that the poet describes, creates a lullaby-like feel that is peaceful and soothing.

Second place: Hay by Watson Winterbourn (Year 2)

This haiku contains some lovely imagery of the grass reaching to the sky – while the poem is short, it creates a lasting real sense of life and light.



Third place: Cabbage by Nayana Abrahamson (Year 3)

A fun poem that celebrates the many ways we can enjoy the humble cabbage. Clever use of rhyme and rhythm.

## **STORIES**

First place: The yummy food by Eleanor Nortje (Year 3)

A story of two apples, one orange and one cake pop who meet in the fridge and discover what's truly important. Clever personification and a beautiful Matariki setting.

Second place: A farming tragedy by Iaera Abrahamson (Year 5)

A haunting story about a girl who makes a secret friend and then discovers that her secret friend has a sad secret of her own. Great use of dialogue.

Third place: Farmer Henry by Ava Blyde (Year 4)

A story of a farmer's battle with loneliness. Deep themes that speak to some important real-world issues.

Highly Commended: Farm Accident by Georgia Blyde (Year 5)

A description laid out in a clever diary format, with strong personal voice from the narrator.
